Public Relations

Hello Everyone!

Since last RSC we are getting in a routine of syncing our meeting data with NAWS on a monthly basis. If you keep your meetings up to date in the BMLT then NAWS will also be correct. Any new meeting you have entered into the BMLT will automatically registered with NAWS when we do a sync and assigned a world committee code which we then insert into the BMLT database. Everyone please continue keep your data up to date! Thank you Trevis for reaching out to the groups in Natchitoches. Their meetings are now listed in our database and will be available on both the Louisiana Region meeting booklet as well as phone and web searches. I appreciate that areas are sending me flyers to post on larna.org. We are also getting more relevant information on the region website as a whole. Thank you for your cooperation and please don't hesitate to offer suggestions to make it better. Yap was set up for the Louisiana Region on Steve S's server. The server went down a few weeks ago and in the interest of time I set it back up on one of my servers. We will move it back when time permits. So far the Region helpline has not been utilized widely. The charges so far are so small that there will be no cost to region for the last quarter. I encourage you to add 585-DONT-USE to your literature. I now have an example of the cost of a Yap helpline. The North Carolina Region paid \$60 in September for 1350 talking minutes and 1700 text messages. This was with a toll free number. The cost would be less with a regular number. Yap has been set up for testing in multiple areas and as yet none of the areas have acted on this either yes or no. For those with the testing install please present this to your ASC as it is costing me money to have these up and running. I am happy to cover the costs up to a point but really need closure as whether to assist you in porting your helpline number, transferring the billing to your area, and going live or to take down the testing install if you are not interested. I will be meeting with the lead developers for Yap at SZFNA in Dallas later this month and hope to get some new features that will make it work better for our region. Please get with me if you have any questions or need something clarified. The Lake area has a new website at www.lakena.org. If any other areas need a website please contact me. At the request of Lee P. a private Facebook group has been set up to discuss CAR2020. We plan on posting the motions a little at a time and discussing each one before moving to the next. We have lots of members but little discussion. I encourage everyone to utilize this resource. I had a request to look at billboards funded by the region. The cost of each billboard would allow us to purchase approx 3 billboards per year. For opening discussion put up billboards in three areas each year, rotating areas each year. With the permission of the region a LA Region Facebook page can be set up, adhering to traditions 11 and 12, as explained in the NA Public Relations Handbook. I'm working on a study to get a cost on targeted ads on Facebook that would also adhere to these same standards and hope to have this information available at April RSC. Currently the fastest growing segment of disseminating information is with social media. The SZFNA in Dallas later this month will be having some PR workshops that I am looking forward to attending. I hope utilize the knowledge gained so as to serve you more effectively. If there is any way I can help in your area please don't hesitate to ask.

Information of Interest

January 4th & 5th, 2020

Members and Trusted Servants of the Louisiana Region:

As is our custom, we are providing you with the minutes for the HCC meetings (LRCNA 37; and LRCNA 38) and the LRCC Board meetings since the last RSC meeting, along with this report.

After LRCNA 39 was granted to the Acadiana Area Bid Committee, an election meeting was held in Lafayette on November 2nd. Those present, elected Lori C as chair, Larry N as Vice Chair, and Ronald S. as Treasurer. They also elected: Leslie H as Secretary; Harold P as Hotel Liaison; Logan K as Arts & Graphics; Scottie H as Merchandise; Kevin M as Program; Sherry D as Registration; Anthony L as Hospitality; and Jeremy B as Entertainment.

At the LRCC meeting the following weekend, while discussing the confirmation of Lori C as the chair for LRCNA 39, concern was raised regarding her serving as both the Vice Chair for 38 and the Chair for 39 at the same time. The consensus on LRCC was that serving as chair, vice chair, or treasurer, on two HCCs at the same time was simply too risky. Given this concern, Lori stated that she would resign as the Vice-Chair for 38 if confirmed for chair of 39. LRCC then voted to confirm her as the chair providing she resign as Vice Chair for LRCNA 38.

During discussion regarding confirmation of Larry N as the Vice Chair for 39, concern was voiced that he did not meet the clean time requirement of 5 years. For this reason, Larry N was not confirmed as the Vice Chair and the HCC will have to have another election for Vice Chair. Ronald S was confirmed as the Treasurer.

Several board members went to the Holiday Inn in Alexandria, along with the chair of the HCC, and negotiated what we think is a pretty good contract with them for next year's convention to be held the weekend before Memorial Day (May 15-17, 2020). That contract was signed on October 28th. Room rates are \$99.00 and there is no food and beverage minimum although the HCC is planning to have a banquet.

On December 7th an orientation meeting was held for LRCNA 39 HCC in which we reviewed the structure of LRCNA, its responsibility to LRCC, and the LRCC's responsibility to the RSC. We also reviewed the convention guidelines and the budget process in particular.

Also during the November 10th LRCC meeting, we conducted elections for LRCC officers for the coming year. I (Bob Storer) was re-elected to another term as Chair, Denise Howell was elected as Vice-Chair, Bob Singer was re-elected to another term as Treasurer, Rock Hudson was elected as Secretary, and Ron Duggins was elected as Vendor Liaison and re-elected as Web Liaison. Finally, we also created the position of Policy Chair and elected Rock Hudson to that position.

The next LRCC meeting is scheduled for January 12th at Grace Baptist Church, Richland Ave, Baton Rouge, at 2 PM.

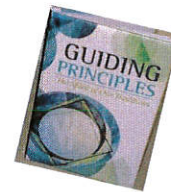
